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## Statement of Intent

### **Aims to eradicate discrimination**

We believe that a greater level of success from pupils and staff can be achieved by realising the uniqueness of individuals. Creating an inclusive environment where individuals feel confident and at ease is a commitment of the school. This environment will be achieved by:

- Adopting an inclusive attitude and ensuring that the whole school community understands what inclusive behaviour looks like in the school and how this aligns with the school's values

Challenging and controversial concepts will be delivered in a way that prevents discrimination and promotes inclusive attitudes.

When an incident is reported, our school is devoted to ensuring appropriate action is taken and a resolution is put into place which is both fair and firm.

- Are our actions effective?
- Are we successful in promoting harmony and preparing pupils to live in a diverse society?
