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What will I be studying?

Health and social care is a subject that has many topic areas and is a good foundation subject for a wide range of careers.

In general, it's about people, their health, individual circumstances and what affect individuals.

Your learning will explore what healthcare and social care service there are and how different job roles support people to meet their individual needs.

First year of study

Unit content for Health and Social Care Provision and Human Lifespan Development. These units look at what different types of H&SC services and provisions there are and how people grow and develop and the factors which affect this. These are assessed through an exam board set Non-Examined Assessment (NEA) that is completed in class time and marked internally. Anatomy and Physiology is also taught in Y12 following the completion of the NEA, this is assessed via a formal written examination.

Second year of study

In the second year you will learn about Empowerment in health and social care and different types of health promotions. Empowerment looks at advocacy and empowering individuals, health promotion looks at ways to encourage people to live healthier lifestyles. These are assessed alongside the content learnt in Y12 via another NEA and formal assessment.






