<p><i>Links: SMSC/PD/Careers/visits</i></p> <p>In the Development topic pupils are introduced to global cultural variations, the importance of tolerance and respect is discussed. Impacts of climate change in the Weather topic, pupils learn about how different parts of the world are experiencing the impacts of climate change disproportionately. Pupils will be introduced to moral/political dilemma of who should be responsible for tackling global change. Impacts and responses to natural hazards in different parts of the world will affect the people and environment in different ways depending on their level of development.</p>

<p><i>Links: SMSC/PD/careers/visits</i></p> <p>In the Urban topic pupils explore the lives of people living in cities around the world which are at different levels of development, they will explore the social, economic and environmental differences between living in HIC (High Income countries) and LIC (Low Income Countries). The value of the fragile, unique ecosystem of the tropical rainforest is covered in the Ecosystems topic, threat to indigenous people are explored, as are the arguments around how the rainforests should be managed in the future for the benefit of all of the people on the planet. In the Population topic pupils explore the cultural, social and moral issues experienced by a variety of countries around the world relating to overpopulation (China) and underpopulation (Russia) Fieldtrip to a coastal zone in the Summer Term. Pupils will study coastal processes, and explore the conflicts between stakeholders relating to how the coast should be managed.</p>

<p><i>Links: SMSC/PD/careers/visits</i></p> <p>Pupils will explore the concept of globalisation, looking at how this impacts the world socially, economically and environmentally. Pupils will explore the idea of global superpowers and have an understanding of past, present and future global players and how geo-politics plays a role in their everyday life, even in rural Lincolnshire.</p> <p>Pupils will explore a range of local and global conflicts, they will learn about the social, cultural and moral impacts of, and responses to these conflicts.</p> <p>In the Managing Resources topic the unequal distribution of resources globally will be explored, and the social impacts of the uneven natural of this. Also the importance of Appropriate Technology and sustainability will be explored, especially in the context of enabling LICs and NEE to meet their energy needs in the future.</p>

Also the moral issues of how climate change should be tackled locally and globally.</p> <p>In the Urban topic pupils look at the social, economic and environmental opportunities and challenges of living in a LIC/NEE city; Rio de Janeiro, in contrast to a HIC/UK city; Bristol.</p> <p>In the River and Coasts topics pupils explore the moral and social issues, and potential conflicts around the management of river flooding and coastal erosion and flooding.</p> <p>Fieldwork will be undertaken in the summer term in Hunstanton in preparation for Paper 3.</p>

	<p><i>Links: SMSC/PD/careers/visits</i></p> <p>In the living world topic pupils explore of managing the tropical rainforest, and use Malaysia as a case study, they will learn about the concept of sustainability and the dilemma between economic growth and environmental protection.</p> <p>In the Changing Economic World pupils will study the uneven natural of development around the world, the historical, political and economic reasons for this, and the social, economic and environmental impacts of this on the people living in LICs and NEEs, focussing on Nigeria’s recent economic growth.</p> <p>Fieldwork in Lincoln will be undertaken in the Autumn term in preparation for Paper 3.</p>
